

## 1 NAME

blaze-log - display the BlazeBlogger repository log

## 2 SYNOPSIS

```
blaze-log [-cqrsCV] [-b directory] [-n number]  
blaze-log -h | -v
```

## 3 DESCRIPTION

**blaze-log** displays the content of the BlazeBlogger repository log.

## 4 OPTIONS

**-b, --blogdir *directory***

Specify the *directory* where the BlazeBlogger repository is placed. The default option is the current working directory.

**-n, --number *number***

List selected number of log records only.

**-s, --short**

Display each log record on a single line.

**-r, --reverse**

Display log records in reverse order.

**-c, --color, --colour**

Enable coloured output, no matter what is set in the configuration.

**-C, --no-color, --no-colour**

Disable coloured output, no matter what is set in the configuration.

**-q, --quiet**

Avoid displaying messages that are not necessary.

**-V, --verbose**

Display all messages. This is the default option.

**-h, --help**

Display usage information and exit.

**-v, --version**

Display version information and exit.
